Rules and Regulations of *Let's Talk!* Initiative THE JOHN PAUL II CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF LUBLIN

1. The John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin is the organizer of *Let's Talk!* initiative.
2. The organizational units coordinating the implementation of *Let's Talk!* initiative are **the Open University, the International Relations Office, International Admissions Office, Lublin Coalition for Integration, School of Polish Language and Culture and the Student Self-Government of KUL.**
3. These Rules and Regulations specify the basic principles of participation in *Let's Talk!* initiative at the John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin, including the initiative's application and participation procedures.
4. In order to apply in *Let's Talk!* initiative, it is required to have a good (communicative) knowledge of a foreign language – English or other (Spanish, Italian, French or German) – enabling communication with Polish students.
5. If a student of the University submits a completed application form to *Let's Talk!* initiative and signed *Rules and Regulations of the Let's Talk! supporting initiative for foreign students*, certifying that they have read these Rules and Regulations, it is tantamount to joining *Let's Talk!* initiative. By completing the form, a student of the University consents to disseminating and processing of their personal data for purposes relating to the implementation and promotion of *Let's Talk!* initiative, and undertakes to stay in touch with a Polish student.
6. It is necessary to have an e-mail account, contact telephone number and provide the preferred way of communication given in the application form for *Let's Talk!* initiative. Data enabling contact will be made available to a Polish student as well as to other persons involved in *Let's Talk!* initiative solely for the purposes of this initiative.
7. A foreign student who is a participant of *Let's Talk!* initiative is required to contact a Polish student designated by an employee of the Open University after agreeing on the dates of the first conversations convenient to both parties. A foreign student confirms their consent to contact the indicated Polish student via e-mail or Messenger application by sending a message.
8. A foreign student who wishes to participate in the initiative has the right to refuse contact with a Polish student only for justified reasons.
9. The Participant's duties include:
 - a) establishing contact with the assigned student via Internet messengers (e.g. Skype, Zoom, Messenger, Microsoft Teams),
 - b) staying in touch with the student during the semester / academic year through friendly relations,
 - c) showing willingness and commitment during conversations with a Polish student,
 - d) showing understanding, conscientiousness and carefulness in dealing with a Polish student,
 - e) showing due respect and maintaining standards of personal culture in dealing with a Polish student.
11. The Guardian participating in *Let's Talk!* initiative is entitled to:
 - a) a certificate of participation in *Let's Talk!* initiative,





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b) take part in team building events – International KUL Day (if organized by the University).

12. Section 11a does not apply to a Participant if they receive a negative assessment of their involvement in the initiative, issued by a Polish student in a survey completed at the end of the period declared upon joining the initiative.

13. If a KUL student resigns from the project or graduates, they are required to inform the Open University of this fact in writing.



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
